Communication and language

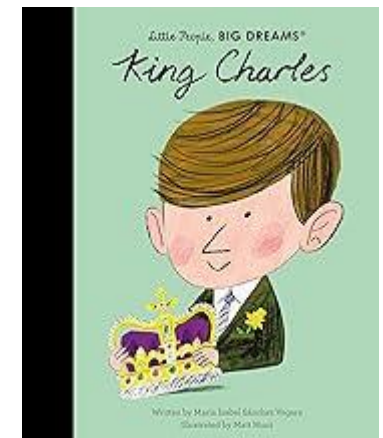
- Learn new vocabulary.
