Expectations

- Reading The children will come home each Monday with an extract appropriate for their age group. We will be studying this extract in our whole class reading sessions throughout the week. Please encourage your child to read this extract aloud to you to practice their fluency. From Tuesday onwards each week the children will be reading sections of this extract aloud in class so please ensure they have it with them.
- **School uniform** Please check that all of your child's belongings are clearly labelled so that they can be returned to him/her if they go missing. There are some 'lost property' pegs in the cloakroom where staff will put all unlabelled items of clothing.

Ways to Help your Child

- Reading Children are expected to read at least 4 times a week and record this in their learning logs. In addition to the whole class extract, which your child will bring home on a Monday, they will also have a library book. They may or may not need your support accessing this book as it will be one they have chosen themselves based on their interests. Please help them with this and enjoy reading it together. Children will be encouraged to change their reading books independently when they are ready however adult support and guidance will be available for those that request it.
- Times tables Children will need to use Times Table Rockstars at home 3 times a week. All
 children have a login for this programme which is a fabulous resource to help children learn their

• **Spelling** - We are continuing to work our way through the statutory spelling lists for each year group. Willow's spellings for spring term 2 are listed below. Other Curricular areas:

During the first half of the summer term, the children will be working on their cricketing skills during PE sessions. After developing our skills, we will be playing small games of cricket using our Sports Education programme where the children will have specific roles within their teams. Our music sessions will involve the children composing their own music to accompany a spooky story using the online platform Charanga. In science, we will continue to focus on Electricity and use our growing knowledge of circuits to complete some mini challenges as well as finishing our steady hand games. Before the half term break, we will also start to look at different states of matter and how to separate these.

In history we will be thinking about the English Civil War. The children will find out about the Royalists and the Parliamentarians, key battles which made up the war and the resulting abolition of the monarchy. In geography, our focus returns to the continent of South America and specifically the effects humans have had on the forests there. We will continue our PSHE work though the My Happy Mind programme as well as thinking about relationships though our JIGSAW scheme of work.

In art we will be looking at the Art Deco Movement from the 1920s and creating work in readiness for Rotherham's Picture This project later in the year.

Thank you for your ongoing support over the last half term.
